

METH TASK FORCE MEETING NOTES

May 12, 2011

Present: L. Burgess, S. Kibler, S. Lindsey, D. Walker, J. Weaver, S. White

- L. Burgess made motion to approve the Agenda. Seconded by S. Kibler and passed unanimously.
- D. Walker motioned to approve Meeting Minutes from 1/13/2011. L. Burgess seconds the motion which carries unanimously.
- Drug Abuse and Awareness Summit was held on April 15th and was well received. S. Lindsey believes it provided good awareness to our community. The Range News is to do an article on the presentation.
- Reviewed all Radio Ad submissions provided. All agreed to Austin Dye as the winner. D. Walker will contact the winner and the schools who participated in the contest. Both D. Walker and J. Weaver will present Award Certificates to the participants. D. Walker will notify Radio Station.
- No new treatment availability concerns or opportunities to discuss.

- The WMTF Spring Newsletter was sent out in March and is reviewed.
- The website has seen a peak of activity in February and followed by significant decline since then. D. Walker reports however she receives frequent phone calls from community members seeking treatment for meth addition and from interested parties from throughout the nation.
- Lion Television contacted D. Walker as they are considering a documentary on meth labs. She provided information to them and directed them to J. Weaver. At this time, they have not contacted Chief Weaver.
- WMTF was profiled in the State's Rural Meth Debrief. Their newsletter is reviewed.
- S. White provides WASA report. They are also currently attempting to find Grant funding.
- Reviewed some new data provided by J. Weaver. Street value of meth is \$80 – 100/gram in Tucson and \$100 – 160/gm in Sierra Vista.
