July 10, 2008

- The MTF is entering into their fourth year!
- MTF will host a booth at the WASA/NCHS sponsored Sports Physicals on July 24th. S. White will follow-up with M. Cronberg for in-service for the teachers this fall. Chamber presentation is still scheduled for October 7th.
- Discussed and reviewed the Matrix model. All members felt that it is worth pursuing. A certified counselor and funding is required. R. Searle continues to search for funding possibilities. During the next month, committee members will seek potential counselor candidates.
