- T. Hill reports on SEABHS treatment availabilities. An IOP continues and is available for adolescents.
- L. Morris reports on treatment availabilities in Cochise County. Pantano Behavioral Health is available for Cochise and Santa Cruz counties. Their offices are in Sierra Vista and Nogales. They receive the same funding as SEABHS but they are only available for clients less than 18 years of age. Sonora Behavioral also services the GSA III area. Their services are inpatient only and do not offer meth treatment. Three Springs is reported to have three beds available.
